### Recorder:

Not just a perfect first instrument for young students. Our recorder programme will teach your students rhythm, musical notation, improvisation, posture and so much more! We also provide continuing opportunities to progress with larger instruments in the recorder family.

### Ukulele:

Learn the fundamentals of chords, melodies and accompaniment with the ukulele. The ideal starter instrument for budding guitarists.

### Music Tech:

This progressive project introduces your students to the world of music production, giving them the skills to write and produce their own beats and songs.

### African Drumming:

You'll be joined by two of our fantastic African Drumming Tutors at your school to teach this dynamic and active programme. Lots of fun for everyone involved.

### Samba:

This high energy programme offers students an immersive musical and cultural experience in Brazilian Samba. Two tutors work with your chosen classes for 10 weeks exploring the world of Samba.

### Strings:

Our strings programme is recommended for Years 4-6 and teaches students to play the violin, alongside the fundamentals of music; rhythm, musical notation, improvisation and much more. An excellent way to introduce students to orchestral playing.

### Brass:

This programme, designed for upper Key stage 2 allows students to explore the brass instrument family, whilst honing their skills and musicality on either the trombone or trumpet.

### Woodwind:

With a choice of saxophone, flute and clarinet or classes of each, our woodwind programme is a brilliant introduction to an orchestral instrument.

### After School/Lunchtime Clubs (only available as an add-on):

A great way of giving more music to the students who want it. These sessions can be tailored to your needs whether that be a choir of instrumental club.
